NAMPA Shares Expert Perspective on BPA

*Video Excerpts from the 2013 ABESO Congress in Brazil Presented by
Dr. William T. Allaben, Adjunct Professor, University of Arkansas*

Washington, D.C. (June 5, 2014) -- In 2013, noted scientist and former U.S. Food and Drug Administration (FDA) official, William T. Allaben, Ph.D., delivered a comprehensive presentation to a gathering of physicians as part of the Annual Obesity and Metabolic Syndrome (ABESO) Congress in Brazil. His presentation addressed the current science and lingering questions about alleged health impacts resulting from human exposure to the chemical bisphenol A, commonly known as BPA.

Dr. Allaben, who is now an Adjunct Professor at the University of Arkansas, spent 33 years serving the public interest as a scientist with FDA, the National Center for Toxicological Research (NCTR), and the National Toxicology Program (NTP). Dr. Allaben's presentation provides much needed context to the BPA debate.
